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<p>Goal of the discipline</p>	<p>The goal of the discipline is to acquaint students with modern ideas about the role of psychological factors in the etiology, pathogenesis and treatment of various human diseases, methods to use in their daily practice, as well as the development of skills of primary diagnostics of mental and behavioral disorders for the direction of the patient to a specialist; as well as development of skills for delivering emergency psychiatric care, pharmacological, psychological and psychotherapeutic correction of mild mental disorders in general medical practice.</p>
<p>Tasks of the discipline</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to develop basic skills to distinguish normal and abnormal behavior; - to develop the ability to establish professionally competent psychological relationships with patients, including those with different types of mental disorders, as well as the ability to determine the necessary correction of this disease; - to acquaint students with the professional activity of psychiatrist: diagnosis, pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy, personal correction and rehabilitation of patients with mental and behavioral disorders; - to acquaint students with current options of treatment and correction of mental and behavioral disorders; - to instill in students the skills of ethics, moral and legal culture necessary for the care of patients with mental and behavioral disorders.
